

2nd Lieutenant William Harold McLEOD

No 213, Lance Sergeant William Harold McLeod was born at Wollongoon Station, Mortlake, Victoria in 1885 to Charles Henry McLeod and Mary (Sutton) McLeod. He was the third child and second son of his father's first marriage. His mother died when he was an infant.

In 1906 William married Emily Willingham and their daughter Felicia died as an infant in 1909.

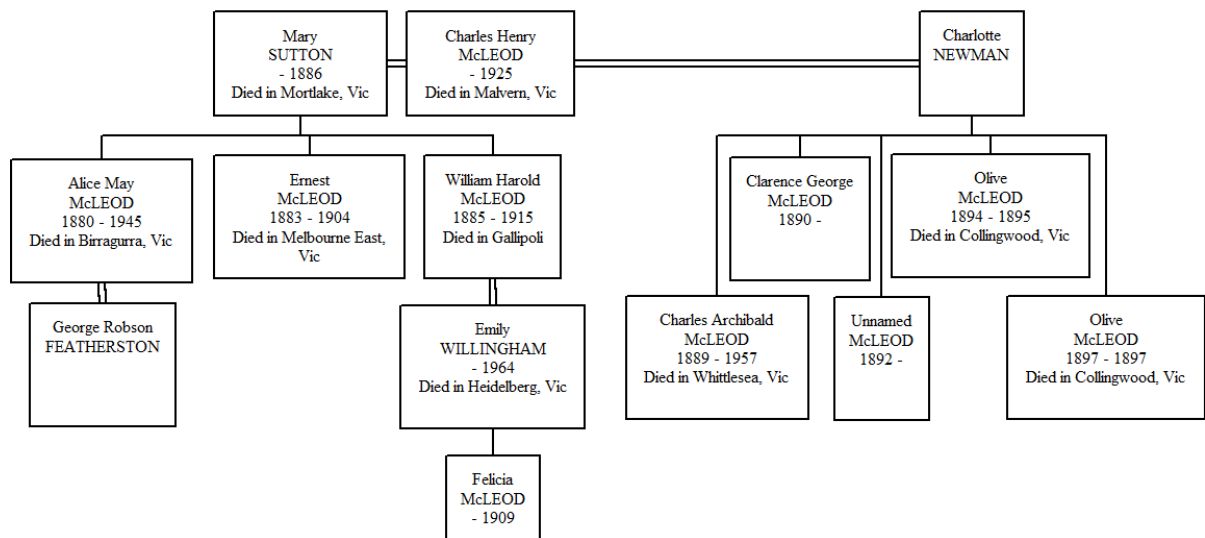
On 17 Aug 1914 he enlisted aged 28 years giving his address as 91 Punt Road, Windsor, Victoria, his occupation as Line Foreman/Senior Linesman and listing his wife as next of kin at 4 Stone St Brighton, Victoria. He was 5'6 tall, weighed 161 lbs, with fair complexion, blue eyes and sandy hair.

With the 5th Battalion, 'B' Coy he embarked from Melbourne, on board Transport A3 *Orvieto* on 21 Oct 1914.



2nd Lieutenant McLeod was killed in action on 8 May 1915 aged 30 years. He has no known grave but is commemorated on the Helles Memorial, Gallipoli, Turkey (Panel 201-204 or 332); on the Roll of Honour at the Australian War Memorial (Panel 44) and on the Memorial Plaque to Bayside's Fallen at Green Point, Brighton Beach, Victoria.
